IF PROPERTY IS IN AGRICULTURE PRODUCTION THE FOLLOWING MANDATORY CONDITION OF APPROVAL APPLIES: Once agricultural production ceases, that area not under immediate development (within 12 months) will be planted to a certified perennial grass seed mix as recommended by a qualified entity such as NRCS, the University of Wyoming Cooperative Extension Service, etc.. Cooperator will revegetate and establish grasses/forbs on that portion of the property previously fallow or in agriculture production. This includes that portion of the property dedicated to open space, parklands, or common areas. In conjunction with the grass seeding, during the first and second years of grass establishment, those areas seeded to grass will be mowed to prevent weed seed development and dispersal (in absence of any herbicide applications).

MANDATORY REVEGETATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL LAND NOT IN PRODUCTION AGRICULTURE: Areas disturbed during subdivision development (road construction, pond construction, service/utility/gas/electric/telephone line installation) will have a 4" (four inch) -6" (six inch) layer of topsoil redistributed onto disturbed areas. Disturbed areas will be seeded to a certified perennial grass mixture as recommended by a qualified entity such as NRCS, the University of Wyoming Cooperative Extension Service, etc. In conjunction with the grass seeding, during the first and second years of grass establishment, these areas seeded to grass will be mowed to prevent weed seed development and dispersal (in absence of herbicide applications).
